**Remaining Assignments:**

April 4	Project proposal	Write a clear statement to propose your project. Be sure to include: 1) objectives, 2) hypotheses, 3) Summary of methods (or anticipated methods), 4) Demonstration of feasibility (this can include references and/or other details clarifying the resources you will use that are available to you).
April 11	Lecture synthesis	You will hear 4 different orthopaedic lectures in class on April 1, 4, 6 & 8. Write a brief synopsis of the take-home messages of each talk (1 paragraph each). In addition provide a brief synthesis of the group of lectures that might include 'revelations' about orthopaedic research, relationships between topics, and what you liked/disliked about lecture topic areas and speaking styles.
April 15	Introduction & Methods	Submit thorough and polished sections on introduction (including motivation) and methods. Please also include some preliminary results or anticipated results. For projects that are predominantly methodological, you can explain this and also describe what you expect to complete for the end of the semester. You may submit this in manuscript format or power point format (hard copies please). Figures are expected along with appropriate figure legends and/or labelling.
Apr 27-May 4	Presentations	Each student will present 25 minute slideshow to the class (20 minute presentation with 5 minutes for Q & A). Lecture notes should be more than simply a printout of your slides and might include additional details on background, methods, and/or results (perhaps including a specific and thorough description of your methodological protocol, solid model design, or description/ code of any computer programs you write).
May 6 (must be submitted by 9:00am May 9)	Final submissions	All students will submit electronic power point file of presentation, printed out handouts (6 slides per page) and lecture notes. ME208 students will update their presentations and lecture notes with all final results, discussion, etc. ME301 students may submit presentation as presented or else updated. However, ME301 must provide all final results, discussion, etc. in their final written report.
